Biographical Note

Reverend William Ladd Chaffin (1837-1923) was born in Oxford, Maine to William Farwell and Louisa Shattuck Chaffin. His father died when he was eight months old and his Mother was physically and financially unable to care for him and his older sister Mary Louisa (1834). The children were sent to live in Concord, New Hampshire with their Aunt Nancy Fessenden. She raised them as her own right alongside her son John Henry.

After graduating from high school, William L. Chaffin worked at his adoptive father's trunk and harness shop for a few years. He then became the Clerk and Assistant Paymaster at the Northern N.H. Railroad Office. In 1857 William L. Chaffin enrolled in the Meadville Theological School to begin his religious studies. He received financial aid from seven generous members of his local Unitarian Society. After graduating in 1861, he preached briefly in Manchester, New Hampshire. A year later he was ordained by the Second Unitarian Church in Philadelphia, and served this church until 1865. From July to September in 1863, he served in the 58th Pennsylvania Infantry. In 1866, he was called to the Unitarian Church in Fitchburg, Massachusetts, but illness forced him to resign. In 1868, he moved to North Easton and became the minister of Unity Church, where he served until his death in 1923.

William L. Chaffin was a religious leader in his communities for 44 years in total, while pursuing his hobbies of local history and genealogy. He was the author of History of the Town of Easton (1886), A Biographical History of Robert Randall and His Descendants (1909), and the History of Robert Chaffin and His Descendants and of the Other Chaffins in America (1913). His final authorship project, The Genealogical History of Easton was never published, but Subgroup 1 of this collection is the direct result of the research for that publication. William L. Chaffin remained a trustee of Meadville Theological School from 1881-1906 and was the first secretary treasurer of its alumni association during the years 1892-98. He received an honorary doctor of divinity degree from Meadville in 1915.

In 1862 William L. Chaffin married Rebecca Huidekoper Bagley (1840-1922), daughter of Michael Hodge and Margaret Lydia Hazelett Bagley. They had no children.

Scope and Content Note

Reverend William L. Chaffin's papers date from 1868 to 1922 and contain genealogical materials and his most popular sermons. Found within them are various letters, listings and historical narratives, all originating from the genealogical materials William L. Chaffin collected for his unwritten book. There are three archival boxes worth of sermons written by him on topics ranging from: suicide and sin to socialism and women's sufferage.

This collection is arranged into two subgroups, each consisting of a different document genre. There are no series or subseries within each, and the materials are ordered alphabetically or chronologically, as will be specified below.

Subgroup 1: Genealogical Materials. The materials in this series are mostly undated, but are estimated to be from the 1880s to the early 1900s. All materials are ordered alphabetically by family name, with significant differences in the amount of items in each family's folder. Some folders contain one item and others around fifty. Notable materials include: letters and listings written by William L. Chaffin, historical narratives relating to the church history, unmarked graves and local gossip, and two three ring binders containing detailed biographical information about William L. Chaffin.

Subgroup 2: William L. Chaffin's Sermons. The materials in this series are dated from 1868 to 1922. All materials are ordered chronologically by the year of creation and alphabetically by sermon title within each year. Notable sermons include: Moral Courage (1873), Only A Cup of Cold Water (1887), Socialism (1901) and Addresses From the Women's Alliance (1909, 1916).

Arrangement

The William L. Chaffin Papers are arranged into two subgroups with no series or subseries. Each subgroup is arranged by document genre and ordered chronologically or alphabetically, as detailed above. The family names and sermon titles included in this collection will be detailed below in the container list.

Related Materials

Notable materials from subgroup 1 that contain previously unknown historical narratives have been digitized. The Religious History of Easton, Massachusetts (1905) by Reverend Chaffin has been digitized and is available on the Society's website. Other items from subgroup 2 may be digitized upon request.
