# Easton's Oldest Photo Displayed

The oldest dated photo from Easton was displayed at a recent open house at the Society Headquarters. This photo of Ann (Pool) Richmond, was taken in her Easton home in 1846. She was thirteen years old.

Ann was a member of the famous Pool family of Easton, manufacturers of levels, transits, compasses and other scientific instruments. The early success of the family is demonstrated by the fact that this portrait



was even taken.

She is dressed in what was probably her Sunday best dress, a fine fabric trimmed in lace. She also wears a ladies watch, a ring and a brooch, probably family heirloom jewelry.

Perhaps the most exciting tidbit is the fact that the photo survived . Two attached handwritten notes from family members provide the details of the photo's location. They also testify to the date of the photo and de-

tail the passing down of the photo to grandchildren and cousins of later generations.
